

“The Feast of Freedom: Jehoiachin”

2 Kings 25:27-30

Felt Need:

People feel that there is a God they should be in a relationship with.

Real Need:

People need to be born again into the family of God.

Basic Truth:

“...Jehoiachin changed his prison clothes and dined regularly with the king all the days of his life...”
2 Kings 25:29

- It means laying aside my prison garb to dine with the king.
- It means that I am set **free** to be the man I was created to be.
- It means to live life as it was meant to be lived.
- What is it that binds you and keeps you from being a free man or woman?
- What **memories** of the past, what **relationships** of the present, what **uncertainties** of the future keep you bound?
- In Jesus’ presence repentance is easy, and the prison garb no longer fits. It binds. It distresses.
- In such moments of repentance, we let go of those habits, those relationships that keep us in bondage. And we become the **free** person He created us to be.
